


The Bundle of Sticks



Greetings our Brothers and Sisters,

It is the most difficult and the easiest to talk about. IF—you are not proud or excited about being a member of the Independent Order of Odd Fellows and do not know about the advantages of being a member, it is very difficult to talk to another person about becoming a member. However, if you are knowledgeable and proud and excited about being a member, it is not only easy to talk about it, but you can't hardly help but talk about your lodge. Villages for Children, and the Arthritis Foundation along with a membership program each year. Do you know about all of these benefits?? There is a list of addresses listed elsewhere in this issue where you can call or write for forms, brochures, or information about each of these programs.

This is a short report, but if every member can realize that we really need new members and it isn't iust talk, then it has done its job.
