WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

- Students who have completed one semester in college in an agriculture field described on the last page of the application.
- · Have an average to above average academic record.
- · Show a need for financial assistance.
- · Demonstrate leadership ability.
- Be enrolled in an accredited two or four year college, university or vocational-technology school.
- · Pursue a career in agriculture.
- Be a member of or be related to a member of an Odd Fellow or Rebekah Lodge. A relative of an applicant shall be defined as the applicant's <u>living</u> spouse, parent, grandparent, great grandparent, aunt, uncle, brother, sister or parent of a spouse of the applicant; and also shall include the applicant's <u>deceased</u> spouse, parent, grandparent or great grandparent.

SCHOLARSHIP AMOUNT AND COVERAGE

One-time awards of \$3,000.00 will be presented to students who meet the eligibility requirements. These awards are based partially on financial need. Recipients of awards are allowed to:

- Transfer from one institution to another and retain the scholarship as long as they maintain their majors in agriculture.
- · Apply funding toward tuition and fees, room, board, books and supplies.

A. Agricultural and Forestry Production Specialist: Agricultural and forest production units reach far beyond the traditional farm managers and ranch/owner/operators. Producers now take advantage at the integrated inputs of science, educators, business representatives and natural resource managers to create a diverse work force.

Combined with a strong emphasis on business communications, writers, broadcasters, science editors, environmental public relations, technical consulting and industrial educators provide an important component in the business structure.

D. Scientists, Engineers and Related Specialists: This group includes professional problem solvers dealing with environmental challenges and is focused on assuring a safe, nutritious and economical food supply. Careers are found in many types of industries but primarily support research-oriented agendas. Bioprocess engineers, food process engineers, plant geneticists, forest scientists, animal reproductive physiologists and horticultural scientists find positions throughout universities, government laboratories and privately operated research programs.
